- Installation of girders for bridge that will span over future State Route 509 extension



#SouthKingSlowdown continues this weekend, October 29-30

Yes, work on I-5 in [south King County](#) continues. This weekend, up to four lanes of southbound I-5 from SR 516/Kent Des Moines Road to South 320th Street will be closed overnight Friday and Saturday, October 29 & 30. Lane reductions will begin nightly at 8:00 PM and all lanes will reopen by noon daily. The southbound I-5 ramp to northbound I-405 ramp will be closed from 9:00 PM to 5:00 AM nightly. Remember, this work is weather dependent.

Election held at SeaTac Community Center

The Greater Seattle Area for The People of Moldova has rented the SeaTac Community Center to accommodate a voting place for the people of Moldova. The voting will take place on Sunday, October 30 from 6:00 AM to 11:59 PM. There will be three voting booths available and they anticipate an estimate of 800 people.
