By putting unwanted leftovers into the correct bin, these organic materials can be composted and turned into a beneficial soil amendment, rather than ending up in the Cedar Hills Regional Landfill.

Curbside Recology CleanScapes residential garbage service includes recycling and food & yard waste service at no additional cost. 96 gallons of food & yard waste and an additional 96 gallons of **extra yard debris only** may be placed at the curb every other week on regular collection day. Please put extra yard waste in heavy paper yard bags, in bundles tied with **fiber** twine (4' x 2' x 2' limit) or in a rigid can with handle and lid (32 gal., 60 lbs. limit) marked "yard". Food scraps are NOT allowed in the extra yard debris. *Please no yard waste in plastic bags or recycling carts.* Contact Recology CleanScapes at 767.1166 with questions.

Holiday Safety Demonstration

According to the National Fire Protection Association, approximately 230 home fires start due to holiday trees each year. These fires result in an average of six deaths, 22 injuries, and over \$18 million in damages.

In addition, one out of every 40 fires that started due to a tree resulted in a death. When compared to the average of one death per 142 fires for all types of home fires, the dangers of a tree fire are staggering. The NFPA says that one third of these fires were caused by electrical problems.

The Puget Sound Skills Center will be hosting two demonstrations next week which the media are invited to showing just how quickly a tree can ignite and burn. In each case, a specially built box will hold the tree and normal home furnishing while a small fire is started near the tree.

To reduce the chances of a tree fire:

- Buy a fresh cut tree
- Saw off the bottom inch of the trunk to create a fresh surface to absorb water
- Keep the tree well-watered and check the water level daily
- Remove the tree from the home if large amounts of needles begin falling off
- Never use candles on or near a tree
- Keep trees away from heat sources such as fireplaces and baseboard heaters
- Use the correct type of holiday lights on the tree
- Consider buying an artificial tree, which are more fire resistant

Fire fact: Almost 40% of residential tree fires take place in January.

Intersection Improvements at Military Road and S. 200th
