There were fewer blood donations over the holidays and consequently the blood center is still trying to find its way out of the holiday plunge in blood inventory.

Currently 6 out of 8 blood types are below levels needed to support patients at 90 hospitals in the Northwest area served by Bloodworks Northwest. 4 types: O+, O-, A+ and B- are all at emergency levels. This means they only have a one day supply. Please see chart to the left for your blood type. If you don't know your blood type, you can find out a few days after you give blood by contacting the blood center.

## CITY OF SEATAC APPEALS 2016 JUDGMENT

**SeaTac, WA** (January 13, 2017) – Today, the City of SeaTac filed its' appellate brief in the K&S Developments, LLC v. City of SeaTac matter at the Washington State Court of Appeals, Division One.

The case pertains to the SeaTac Center which is located at South 154<sup>th</sup> Street and International Boulevard in the City's South 154<sup>th</sup> Street Station Area.

# CONSTRUCTION AND TRAFFIC ALERTS

## 2017 Annual Overlay Location Selected

The City has selected 12th Place S. and 13th Avenue S. (from S. 200th Street to S. 207th Street) and S. 207th Street from 12th Place S. to 14th Avenue S. for the 2017 annual overlay project. In addition to new pavement, there will be minor storm drainage system improvements. Smooth roads ahead!

## Intersection Improvements at Military Road and S 200th

Construction work by WSDOT is continuing on the Southbound I-5 interchange at Military Road South and South 200th Street. This work will widen and realign the intersection and install new traffic signals to allow for easier access between I-5 and, the Angle Lake Light Rail Station, and the City of SeaTac. Please plan alternate routes around the area if possible. Please contact 440.4DOT (4368) for any noise related complaints or the 24-hour construction hotline at 888.298.2395.

What to expect:

- The intersection will be rebuilt in phases to minimize impacts to the traveling public.
- Motorists should expect travel delays during construction on S. 200th Street, Military Road, the southbound I-5 off-ramp to S. 200th Street/Military Road, and the S. 200th Street/Military Road on-ramp to southbound I-5 with increased delays during weekday commuting hours.
- Lanes may be reduced during construction. There may also be periodic I-5 ramp closures at this location. Signage and flaggers will help motorists and pedestrians get safely around the work zone. Ramp closures will be announced in advance using electronic message signs.
- Typical work times will be between 7:00 AM and 5:00 PM on weekdays and nighttime work will also be happening. The City has approved a noise variance for nighttime work for this project.

- Expect noise from equipment breaking up and removing existing sections of asphalt and other activities (trucks, excavators, bulldozers, vector trucks, drill rigs, sawcutting equipment). Lighting will be used to illuminate the work area during nighttime hours.



## Recovery of Stolen Vehicle Leads to Mail Theft Suspect

On January 6 at about 2:15 AM, Deputy Pat Kelly found an occupied, stolen vehicle in the parking lot of the Motel 6 at S. 165th Street and International Blvd. He and his partners took the driver into custody to further investigate the stolen vehicle. They soon realized that the driver was a subject that SeaTac Police have been looking for, connected to multiple mail thefts in our City. Officers recovered two bags of mail and drug paraphernalia from the car which was eventually returned to its legal owner. The suspect was booked into King County Jail for investigation of Mail Theft, investigation of Possession of a Stolen Motor Vehicle and \$30,000 in outstanding warrants.

## Good Samaritans Citizens at January 10 Council Meeting

At the January 10 Regular Council Meeting, Chief Mulligan and members of the SeaTac Police Department, recognized two citizens who came to the aid of Officer Chris Kyle on the morning of January 2.



Officer Kyle was working to arrest a fighting suspect at S. 165th Street and International Blvd. Back up officers had not arrived to assist him yet and Officer Kyle was struggling to keep the suspect from reaching his gunbelt. A passerby, Bo Wade (pictured right of Officer Kyle), saw the struggle and that Officer Kyle was alone. He called 911 to report what he was seeing as he made a U-turn so that he could go back to help. Before he could get there, Richard McLaughlin (pictured left of Officer Kyle) stopped his Masterpark shuttle bus, got out and physically assisted Officer Kyle get the suspect handcuffed. Once the male was in custody, officers found a loaded handgun in his waistband.

Members of the SeaTac Police are deeply honored by these selfless acts to assist our officer.

## Armed Carjacking, Associated with Craigslist Ad

The victim in this case was attempting to purchase a Macintosh tablet from a man he met on Craigslist. The victim agreed to meet the seller in SeaTac, at an apartment complex in the 3500 block of S. 204 Street. When the victim and his friend arrived, they were met by two males who got into their car, pulled guns on them and ultimately told them to get out of the car. The victim's cell phones were also stolen. The suspects were not located.

## City Commissioning Study to Establish a Permitted Parking Program (PPP)

In response to the community's concerns related to on-street parking, the City will be advertising a Request for Proposals (RFP) to deliver a Permit Parking Program Study in early 2017. The study will help establish a Permit Parking Program (PPP) and define the following:



- Costs to administer the PPP and sources of funding
- Recommend a fee structure for permitted parking
- Delineate areas in the City that permitted parking may be implemented
- Administration of the program
- Type of equipment/infrastructure required for the PPP
- Structure for enforcement/penalties

Consultant selection will be completed in early 2017 and shortly thereafter, a program schedule will be developed identifying the expected implementation timeframe. Implementation funding has been approved and is budgeted for 2018, although funding may be moved forward if rapid progress is made in 2017.
